Materials: Book- Up Home (by Shauntay Grant), personal connection sheet, Venn Diagram (This can be two separate lessons)

Procedure:

- 1. Introduce the book and the author (bio in the book).
- **2.** Look at the cover of the story and ask students what is going on in the picture? What do they think the story is about?
- **3.** Ask students what are some things in their community they like to do? Record answers on chart paper.
- **4.** Read the story. Stopping in various places that are similar or different then their answers.
- **5.** After reading, ask students to compare the things that Shauntay loved doing in her community of North Preston to things they liked doing in their community. Talk about respect and appreciation for differences in people and amongst themselves in the classroom culturally. Make a Venn Diagram.

- 6. Get students to make a personnel connection to the text and draw a picture and write about it. The Gr.'s 2-3 would be able to support their answers with more detail, and include feelings and/or emotions with their connection.
- **7.** Share connections with classmates. Note how there are similarities and differences within the same community as well.
